Cricket laws will apply unless listed below. 2. Matches shall consist of one indent per team of 40 or 50 overs or less if the start is delayed or as agreed between them. If the team that will be the first is carved into less than assigned nads, unused nads will not be available to the team that will be the last. 3. The winning team is the team that has the most runs. 4. 4 points are awarded for winning, 3 for unsaluted and 2 for results. 5. In the league will be won by the team that will win the most points at the end of the programme of matches. If the league final table has two or more teams tied for 1st place, the winner will be the team that will have the most wins of the season. If that doesn't separate the teams, the league title will be shared. Bowling limit 6. No bowler will be a bowler more than 1/5 of all allowed overs. 7. In case the bowler can't finish more, another bowler will bowl the rest of the ball. Such parts of the supersedes will be regarded as perfect in both bowls. Suspensions for game 8. The full allocation of supersedes, despite the interruption, can still be played out if there is a thought that there is sufficient time. 9. A break between the first innings of a game can lead to an agreed reduction in the total allocation equal to one over each of the individual innings for every 3 minutes of the lost game. 10. A break during the second innings can result in a reduction in the allocation of a team that is the second equivalent of one more for every 4 minutes of lost play. 11. The Duckworth/Lewis method (D/L) applies to all matches. If any match is interrupted after it has started by reducing the number of supersedes available on either side from the number to be determined at the start of the match, the revised target shall be calculated using method D/L. 12. The fractions will be rounded to the nearest whole number in all calculations. 13. If a match to be played has to be interrupted, the team other must receive at least 15 overs. Score 14. If the results finish level then the team loses fewer wickets going to the winner. 15. If the results finish level and both teams lose the same number of wickets the result will be uneven. Field limits 16. The semi-circles, 30 meters from the middle stump at each end of the pitch will be marked by discs, and the semicircles will be joined by additional discs in lines 60 meters away and parallel to the playground. 17. At all times, there must be at least four SUVs within the pitch, in addition to the wicketkeeper and bowler. 18. For the first 1/4 overs of all innings, regardless of its duration, only two SUVs are allowed outside the 30-yard circle. 19. The penalty for violating the rules on field games is to nominate any of the wording without the ball. 20. In a reduced-overs game, the field restrictions are reduced proportionately.
